The Ten Commandments:

“You Shall Not Murder”

- What exactly did the sixth commandment prohibit?
 - The Hebrew word ratsach is translated in the KJV as “kill” but it is better translated “murder”. ***Exo. 20:13***
 - There is a clear difference between killing and murdering. ***Exo. 32:26-29, 21:12-14, Deut. 19:11-13***
 - The penalty for killing and murdering were very different. ***Deut. 19:2-5; Num. 35:31***

The Ten Commandments:

“You Shall Not Murder”

- Ways in which the Jews violated this command:
 - By it David tried to hide his sin.
2 Sam. 11:14-17; 12:9-12
 - Because of greed, Jezebel had Naboth murdered. ***1 Kings 21:1-16***
 - In her ambition, Athaliah murdered her grandchildren. ***2 Kings 11:1***

The Ten Commandments:

“You Shall Not Murder”

- The lesson for us today:
 - Remember that we are not under any part of the law. *Col. 2:14, 16-17; Rom. 7:4*
 - Yet, we are under a greater responsibility. *Matt. 5:21-22; 1 John 3:15*
 - The penalty under the N.T. is eternal death. *Rev. 21:8*
