- W. Ray Duncan of the Cincinnati area (circa 1945) taught Delbert Gilliland the gospel and Delbert was baptized into Christ.
- In early 1950, Delbert, Emma Mae and Ron Gilliland together with Bob Smith, his wife and daughter decided to begin a congregation in Hillsboro that would worship following the patter found in the New Testament.

On February 5, 1950 the new congregation had its first service on the third floor of the Farmers & Traders Bank building (they paid 20 dlls. a month in rent).

- Walter L. Nichols (of Portsmouth) preached, and there was an attendance for the morning service of 31 people, and 26 for the evening service.
- The following Sunday (Feb. 12, 1950), morning attendance was 36, but a singing service that afternoon had an attendance of 93.

Early in 1954 a lot was purchased on the corner of South West and Park Avenue. The construction of a building began and worship soon took place, the congregation identified itself as the Park Avenue church of Christ.







In 1976 the congregation had outgrown that building and a lot was secured on Greenfield Pike. On February 5, 1977, the congregation moved to their present location being known as the Northside church of Christ.



#### "Can We Worship The Holy Spirit?"

"When Peter entered, Cornelius met him and fell down at his feet and worshiped him. But Peter lifted him up, saying, 'Stand up; I too am a man" (Acts 10.25-26). Since God sent Cornelius a messenger to tell him what he must do, Cornelius, being the good man that he was, obviously felt the need to show honor and praise to God's herald. In this passage Peter says something that we would do well to comprehend for this study: "Stand up; I too am a man." Peter's words have implications. First and foremost that he is not to be worshipped because he is not God, and second, that only God can be worshipped.

This truth is replete in Scripture. For instance God told the Israelites, "You shall not make for yourself a carved image, or any likeness of anything that is in heaven above, or that is in the earth beneath, or that is in the water under the earth. You shall not bow down to them or serve them, for I the Lord your God am a jealous God" (Exo. 20.4-5). Elsewhere, Jesus told Satan, "You shall worship the Lord your God and him only shall you serve" (Matt. 4.10). His word not only denies worship to the apostles as seen above, it also restricts us from worshipping angels (Col. 2.18). Therefore, God is "...worthy to be praised"

Thus it can be stated that those who love God must worship Him and they must give Him all the glory, honor and praise. While men, angels and carved images are excluded, the question is sometimes asked: "What about the Spirit of God, can He be worshipped?" To answer such a question we must first understand who, or what, the Holy Spirit is.

The Scriptures teach that the Holy Spirit is Deity. When Peter confronted Anamias he said, why has Satan filled your heart to lie to the Holy Spirit and to keep back for yourself part of the proceeds of the land? While it remained unsold, did it not remain your own? And after it was sold, was it not at your disposal? Why is it that you have contrived this deed in your heart? You have not lied to man but to God." Further, Peter said, ""How is it that you have agreed together to test the Spirit

of the Lord?" (Acts 5.3-4, 9). Since Peter attributed the Holy Spirit as God, it can be said that the Holy Spirit is God.

(Psalm 18.3) and "greatly to be praised" (Psalm 48.1).

If He is Deity, then He must be able to fit the description of such. The Scriptures bear out that He is omniscient, i.e., knowing all things and omnipresent, i.e. everywhere present (1 Cor. 2.10-11; Psalm 139.7-10). None would conclude after diligent

Bible study that God does not know all things or that He is not everywhere. This then is an indicator of the divine nature.
